



Credit by Exam

Jefferson College uses several tests designed to grant college credit to students with a wide variety of educational experiences. Any student enrolled at Jefferson College who has or would like to participate in the following programs may be eligible:

- College Level Examination Program
- Advanced Placement Program
- Departmental Proficiency Exam Program

Students are encouraged to consult with Jefferson College faculty advisors or department Deans regarding the use of credit by examination in their educational planning.

Policy Statements

Grades for Credit by Examination: Credits earned by examination are equated, when possible, to a specific Jefferson College course. This course will appear on the Jefferson College Transcript with the note, "Credit by Examination." No letter grade will be given; a dash will appear in lieu of a grade. Failure to pass an examination will not be recorded. Credits accumulate toward the 62-semester hour associate degree requirement.

Students may test out of no more than 30 college credit hours. The credit awarded will not affect GPA.

Transfer of Credit by Examination: Students should be advised that different colleges use different policies on the acceptance of credit by examination. We encourage students to have current transfer guidelines in hand before testing.

Improving Prior Grades: The Credit by Examination program measures learning achieved through non-traditional curriculum experiences. Students may not use this program to upgrade college courses with deficient grades.

CLEP

The College Level Examination Program (CLEP) is designed to evaluate your college-level learning, no matter how or where the learning took place. CLEP examinations, designed by the College Entrance Exam Board, are divided into two types, general and subject. Jefferson College will grant credit for subject exams.

When the exam is similar in content to a course offered by Jefferson College, credit will be equated to a specific course. When no course equivalent exists at Jefferson, credit may be granted as elective hours in the same field as the examination. Credit would be recorded on the student's transcript and identified with a dash instead of a grade.

Students who have college credit should note that credit will not be given for CLEP exams if the student has college credit for the equivalent course.

Fees for CLEP will total \$100 per test.

CLEP charges an \$80 fee, and Jefferson College charges a \$20 fee to proctor the exam.

Posting Fee: There is a fee for posting the credits on your transcript, which is equivalent to one credit hour of tuition at Jefferson College.

Students interested in taking these exams can obtain information about testing centers, exam information and registration procedures by contacting the Testing Center at Jefferson College, (636)797-3000 or 942-3000, ext. 3147 or 3164. If a student is interested in obtaining college credit from Jefferson College, a copy of the test scores should be sent to the Registrar's Office with a request that the office evaluate test score transcripts for college credit. There is a fee for posting the credits on your transcript, which is equivalent to one credit hour of tuition at Jefferson College.

* To receive credit for English Composition I, an essay, graded by Jefferson College English faculty, must be successfully completed in addition to receiving a passing score on the CLEP Freshman College Composition test.

Military Experience

Experience in the Armed Services may be considered for credit based upon:

1. The relevance of such skills to the student's graduation plans and major area of study, (***and***)
2. The recommendation of the American Council on Education: Commission on Accreditation of Service Experiences as stated in "A Guide to the Evaluation of Educational Experiences in the Armed Services."

Posting Fee: There is a fee for posting the credits on your transcript, which is equivalent to one credit hour of tuition at Jefferson College.

Advanced Placement Programs (AP)

Sponsoring high schools that have offered A.P. classes provide for A.P. Examinations at the end of the course. Students forward the results of the A.P. Exams through the College Entrance Examination Board to Jefferson College. College credit is granted for students earning a minimum score of three (3) on the exam.

Posting Fee: There is a fee for posting the credits on your transcript, which is equivalent to one credit hour of tuition at Jefferson College.

Contact the Department's Division Chair or appropriate faculty person for applications. The cost is \$40.00 per exam plus a fee for posting the credits on your transcript, which is equivalent to one credit hour of tuition at Jefferson College.
