

Clinical Assignments

Students will be assigned to clinical rotations during the 2nd-5th semester of the Program.

Each student will be responsible for their own transportation to and from the clinical site. The hours may vary slightly from site to site, but will typically be 7:00am-3:30 pm. No student will be assigned to a site more than 10 hours per day or 40 hours per week.

For each clinical rotation, the student will either complete orientation, specialty objectives or be evaluated by the clinical instructor on the student's professional development. For orientation and specialty rotations, the student will complete the appropriate clinical objectives, have the objective form signed by the students supervising technologist and turn it in to the clinical coordinator at the designated time. Failure to turn in the objective sheet will result in a 3% deduction of the clinical grade for the semester. Failure to turn in any objective sheet within 4 weeks of completion of that rotation will result in a zero for that rotation and a 3% deduction off of the clinical grade for the semester. All objectives must be completed in order to complete course requirements. Until course requirements are met the final grade will be an incomplete.
