The Bi-level Nursing Program is committed to the development of both practical and professional nursing. Students admitted to Level I/PN complete a course of study leading to eligibility for licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

Level I / PN is offered as a **part-time** evening program with completion in 24 months. Students meeting progression requirements (i.e. maintain a cumulative 85% average in all Level I/PN courses) are automatically admitted to Level II/RN.

(*) These courses are required pre-requisites for the Level II/RN program.

Admission Requirements:

1. **Apply** to [Jefferson College](http://www.jeffco.edu) and provide *official* transcripts to the Office of Enrollment Services either electronically or by mail to 1000 Viking Drive, Hillsboro, MO 63050. **Meet with an Advising Specialist:** advisor@jeffco.edu or 636-481-3209/797-3000, ext. 3209.
2. **ATI TEAS Entrance Exam:** To be considered for admission a candidate must earn a minimum composite score of 58.7% on the TEAS Exam. The [ATI TEAS Exam](#), or Test of Essential Academic Skills, is a standardized test designed specifically to assess a student's preparedness for entering the health science fields. Questions are designed to test the basic academic skills you will need to perform successfully in the areas of: Reading, Math, Science, and English and Language Usage.
 - **Study guide:** Study manuals are available for one week check-out at the Jefferson College Library. Study manuals are also available for purchase on the [ATI website](#).
 - **Exam Fee:** The TEAS exam fee is \$75.00 to be paid at the cashier's window prior to testing.
 - **Retest:** Students can retake the ATI TEAS exam **once every 60 days**. During the waiting period students are strongly encouraged to remediate the areas they scored basic or developmental. A Focused Review will be available in your ATI account. Jefferson College will **not** accept test scores taken **prior to the end of the two-month waiting period**, regardless of the score obtained.
3. **GPA Requirement:** Minimum of 2.8 (on a 4.0 scale). GPA is calculated utilizing Level I/PN and Level II/RN prerequisite and corequisite courses only.
4. **Pre-requisites:** Students must meet all prerequisite requirements prior to nursing program start date.
 - BIO 211 Anatomy & Physiology I - *completed with a grade of "C" or better within 5 years of the program start date. The prerequisite for BIO 211 is BIO 101 (or high school Biology) and CHM 101 (or high school Chemistry) with grades of "C" or better within 5 years of registration date.*
 - PSY 101 General Psychology - *completed with a "C" or better.*
 - COL 100; COL 136; COL 101- First Year Experience - *This course **may not** be required for students who have previously completed 15+ credit hours of college credit.*
5. The application for admission, application deadline, and application fee and submission information may be found on the nursing website at www.jeffco.edu/nursing > Application Process > Pre-Admission FAQs *and* Beginning Level I PN.

Admission is competitive; the Admission Progression Retention (APR) Committee chooses the final selection of applicants based on the following criteria: TEAS exam score, nursing pre/corequisite GPA, and course completion rate.
