**Program Description:** Bi-Level Nursing Program – Level 2 Registered Nurse (Days)

The Bi-level Nursing Program is committed to the development of both practical and professional nursing. Level II is an associate of applied science degree program leading to eligibility for licensure as a Registered Professional Nurse (RN). The day program is **full-time** and can be completed within 10 months (2 semesters: Fall/Spring). (\*) These courses are required for the AAS degree.

**Progression Requirements from Level I/ LPN to Level II/ RN:**

The Bi-level Nursing program is a one plus one program. All students are expected to progress from Level I/PN to Level II/RN. However, to ensure student success the following criteria must be met:

1. Maintain a cumulative 85% average in all Level I/PN courses.
2. Must successfully complete NCLEX-PN exam leading to licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) by the last day of the first eight-week session of enrollment in Level II/RN. In the case that the student fails licensure as an LPN, the student must officially withdraw from all nursing courses by the designated withdrawal date to avoid receiving an ‘F’.
3. Student must meet the benchmark score on a majority of the standardized integrated examinations given to students in level I nursing courses. If student fails to achieve the required minimum benchmark, a version of the exam may be retaken one time, following exam remediation, within five days of first exam. Please note, only the first attempt grade is applied toward course grade.

*Failure to complete any of the above criteria will prevent progression to Level II/RN and result in student-initiated withdrawal from the nursing program. Any Level I/PN student **not** progressing with the cohort will be considered a bridge student and therefore must meet all bridging student requirements.*

**Admission Requirements to Level II / RN (Bridging):**

1. Complete a free Jefferson College application at [www.jeffco.edu/admissions](http://www.jeffco.edu/admissions); provide **Official** transcripts to the **Admissions Office** at 1000 Viking Drive, Hillsboro, MO 63050. Meet with an enrollment specialist.
2. **HESI Mobility Entrance Exam:** To be considered for admission a candidate must earn a minimum of 850. Cost of the HESI Mobility is \$60.00 (effective July 1, 2019) to be paid at the cashier’s office prior to testing. HESI Mobility scores range from 0 – 1,000, and can be as high as 1,500 (depending on the difficulty level of the exam). 850 is the minimum requirement. However, HESI’s recommended level of performance is 900 and above for all scores provided.

3. After meeting the minimum HESI Mobility exam score of 850, the nursing program application can be obtained from the nursing office located on the Hillsboro campus in CTE 131 or by visiting [www.jeffco.edu/nursing](http://www.jeffco.edu/nursing). The application deadline is the first Monday in April.
4. The nursing program application fee is \$30 to be paid to the cashier. Application is to be turned into the nursing office and **will not** be accepted without receipt of paid application fee, printed copy of your HESI Mobility score, printed copy of course schedule (if applicable), **and** a copy of your current undisciplined LPN license.
5. **GPA of 2.8** (on a 4.0 scale). GPA is calculated utilizing Level I/PN and Level II/RN pre-requisite and co-requisite courses.
6. **Pre-requisites:**
  - Students must meet all pre-requisite requirements prior to nursing program start date.
    - Undisciplined Missouri Licensure as an LPN with I.V. Certification
    - BIO 211 Anatomy & Physiology I - *completed with a grade of “C” or better within 5 years of the program start date.*
    - BIO 211 Anatomy & Physiology II - *completed with a grade of “C” or better within 5 years of the program start date.*
    - PSY 101 General Psychology - *completed with a “C” or better.*
    - PSY 205 Life Span Human Development - *completed with a “C” or better.*

*Admission is competitive with the Admission Progression Retention Committee making the final decision for selection of applicants based on several criteria.*
