



Jefferson College Level II/RN HESI Mobility (Bridge) Exam

Admission to the nursing program is highly competitive; we cannot guarantee admission to all eligible applicants who meet minimum requirements.

The HESI Mobility Exam ensures that the already licensed LPN is ready to take the next step in his/her education. The exam is offered on a walk-in basis and can be taken at the Hillsboro or Arnold testing center. The testing fee is \$60 (effective July 1, 2019) to be paid at the Jefferson College cashier desk by cash or debit/credit card. Bring paid receipt to the testing center on the day you would like to test.

The HESI Mobility testing period runs year-round. Students are eligible to complete the HESI Mobility a **maximum of twice per year, one time** during the testing period of **January 1-June 30**, and **one time** during the testing period of **July 1-December 31**. To be considered for admission, candidates must earn a minimum score of 850. HESI Mobility scores range from 0 – 1,000 and can be as high as 1,500 (depending on the difficulty level of the exam). HESI's recommended level of performance is 900 and above for all scores provided. HESI scores have been linked to nursing student success.

HESI Mobility test scores for the RN program are valid for 2 years prior to program start date.

The time limit for the test is 2 hours and 30 minutes. Registering for the test will take about 30 minutes so students should allow a total of **3 hours** to complete the exam.

Students will be permitted the use of scratch paper, which will be collected by Testing Center staff and immediately shredded. A calculator tool will be enabled for student use within the test.

Students with documented disabilities may request the college Accommodation Committee to approve extended test taking time or other possible accommodations. Students will need to make arrangements in advance for this and any other possible accommodation. Contact Disability Support Services for more information (636) 481-3169.

If a student does not meet minimum requirements on the HESI Mobility exam, as stated above, the student will then need to wait until the next available testing period to retake. Preparation for the exam is very important and can be done using the following study materials:
