This training focuses on the Civil Involuntary Detention (CID) process, also known as the 96 hour hold. This training is applicable to all law enforcement personnel, as the CID process can be complicated and sometimes confusing. This training will also provide time to discuss and ask questions about local procedures.

Course Description:

Training topics include differentiating types of risk, writing an effective affidavit, hospital procedures to encourage smooth hospitalizations, where to find a notary and identifying forms required for civil involuntary detainment.

Depression and bipolar provides an overview of a couple of mental health disorders that law enforcement is likely to encounter. We will focus on mental health stigma, and discuss how officers can address it with people they come in contact with. Mental health stigma keeps people from admitting problems and getting help and makes it more likely they will have repeat visits from law enforcement. We will discuss tools that will aid officers in their interactions with individuals
