Clinical Requirements & Immunization Checklist

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All requirements will be uploaded into Viewpoint Screening, the online platform for clinical compliance tracking. Students will be enrolled in Viewpoint Screening during orientation.

Urine Drug Screen: This may be completed at any LabCorp center in the area.

- Upon enrollment in the Viewpoint Screening platform, you will receive an email with instructions on how to complete your urine drug screening.
- The screening can be completed at any [LabCorp location](#)
 - The results will be uploaded directly to your Viewpoint Screening account.
- The deadline for completion of your drug screening is: *****

Physical Examination: Provide documentation of completed medical history and examination form signed by a medical professional. Forms are provided in your orientation packet and are also available in Viewpoint Screening.

BLS-CPR: Provide a current American Heart Association (AHA) – Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers – Adult, Child & Infant CPR Certification with AED training.

Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (Tdap): Provide documentation of **one Tdap vaccination** administered within the last 10 years or provide documentation of an approved exemption.

Varicella (Chicken Pox): Provide documentation of **two doses** of varicella vaccine at least 4 weeks apart, a titer showing immunity, or documentation of an approved exemption.

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Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR): Provide documentation of **two doses** of the MMR vaccine at least 4 weeks apart, a titer* showing immunity to all three components: Measles, Mumps, and Rubella, or provide documentation of exemption.

*All three components must be listed on the titer to be considered fully immune.

Hepatitis B Series: Recommended vaccination. Provide documentation of **3 vaccinations***, titer showing immunity, or completion of Hepatitis B declination form.

*This is a 3-vaccine series that will take a total of 6 months to complete. If choosing to vaccinate, the first vaccine must be initiated by the set due date. The remainder of the series may be completed while in program, and clinical may be attended if series is in progress.

Tuberculosis (TB) Screening: Documentation of any of the following is acceptable:

On Program Admission:

- Negative TB blood test (*ex. Quantiferon Gold, T-Spot, Interferon Gamma Release Assay-IGRA*)
- Negative Two-step TB skin test* (PPD) (total of 4 visits-*see example below*)
- Negative chest x-ray must be documented if blood or skin test are positive. Chest x-rays are good for two years.

Annual renewal will be determined through the completion of an annual self-risk assessment form. Subsequent TB testing may be required following risk assessment or by individual clinical partners.

***Example of two-step TB skin test (PPD):**

First visit: PPD #1 administered on June 2	Second visit: PPD #1 read on June 4
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The second PPD must be completed at least 7 days after the first PPD but no more than 21 days after the first PPD.

Third visit: PPD #2 administered on June 16	Fourth visit: PPD #2 read on June 18
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Flu Vaccination: Provide documentation of flu shot administered during the **current** flu season or documentation of an approved exemption.

Covid Vaccination: Provide documentation of Covid vaccination dose and/or completed series, or documentation of an approved exemption.
