
Missouri Bicentennial Celebration to Feature Jefferson College Library Historical Map Display

The Foundation Renews Relationship with Major Donor

In 2006, the Foundation's Board of Directors announced that it had received a verbal agreement for a significant donation from David Ault, owner and president of the Fox Run Golf Club. Six years later, a gift agreement was signed by Mr. Ault to immediately donate a newly built and fully furnished home at Fox Run, free membership to Fox Run, and a bequest of \$500,000. The agreement also stipulated that the Foundation and Ault maintain a relationship going forward.

"I decided that it was the right time to do this, and by spreading the word, perhaps others will follow," Ault said in a 2012 public statement. "Jefferson College is a valuable asset to our community and its excellence is demonstrated in the thousands of graduates that live and work throughout the region."

Since the public announcement of the gift, the Foundation held several golf tournaments at Fox Run, and hosted donor-recognition events at the donated home on the golf course. During this time, the Foundation also experienced a number of staff changes, and these changes lost the connection between Mr. Ault and the Foundation over time.

At the end of March 2021, the Foundation renewed its relationship with Mr. Ault during a meeting at the Fox Run Clubhouse that included College President Dr. Dena McCaffrey. During the meeting, Ault was clear that he continues to value Jefferson College and its students, and reinforced his commitment with the gift agreement made in 2012. The Foundation also agreed to regularly provide information and updates of all recent College news.

The Foundation seeks to connect the College with individuals who have a passion for giving. Whether the individual is an alumnus, community supporter, or local business owner, the Foundation will foster a relationship to create a meaningful experience and regular connection between the two.
