Furthermore, all of the hours spent in a classroom allow the preservice teacher to gain knowledge from several different teaching styles and settings. Finally, the time spent at Confluence Academy allowed my personal growth for diversity in a classroom setting. This growth, again, is not an aspect that can be found in the typical college classroom. Second, the work expected and level of teaching received allowed me to build skills required at the four-year college level.
